

SALT LAKE CITY ORDINANCE

No. _____ of 2025

Approving a compensation adjustment for elected and statutory officers, and executive municipal officers of Salt Lake City Corporation.

WHEREAS, Utah Code § 10-3-818 provides a process for adjusting compensation for elected and statutory officers and for executive municipal officers of a municipality; and

WHEREAS, Salt Lake City Corporation (the “City”) desires to adjust the compensation of certain elected and statutory officers and of certain executive municipal officers of the City; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing regarding such compensation adjustments, for which public notice was properly published pursuant to Utah Code § 10-3-818(2)(B) and Utah Code § 63G-30-102, was held before the City Council of Salt Lake City on June 3, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the procedural requirements set forth in Utah Code § 10-3-818 regarding this proposed compensation adjustment have now been satisfied;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1. The compensation adjustments for City’s elected and statutory officers, and for City’s executive municipal officers, including any compensation schedules corresponding to such adjustments, as set forth in the attached Exhibit “A” are hereby approved and adopted.

SECTION 2. The adopted compensation adjustments for City’s elected and statutory officers, and for City’s municipal executive officers, including any compensation schedules corresponding to such adjustments, shall be included in the final budget of Salt Lake City Corporation.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be deemed effective on July 1, 2025.
