Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs provide critical Federal funding that allows Salt Lake City (SLC) to provide high-quality services to residents and implement local solutions to local problems.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT (2015 – 2024)

Congress invested over **\$53.7M** in HUD funds into SLC...



...and SLC leveraged **\$165.1M** from local private and public partners.
